Important Reading

We hope you read this page in each of the issues. Although it is administrative in nature we think it is very important to our overall objectives. Most of the comments come from thoughts and ideas that develop during the quarter between issues, and from things we run into at the last minute as we put the issue together.

Family Arrangement

With this issue we are making a small change in our format. Some have suggested that we arrange our inquiries and exchange information by family line. In keeping with that suggestion we are introducing several new family lines in this issue and are dividing our Exchange-Inquiry page into segments associated with the various families.

In reviewing information sent in by all the Alfs, it seems we now have seven family groups. Five of the seven are included in this issue. Those included are two from the last issue, Thomas Alford, born 1725 and Jacob Alford, born 1738. New families are Jacob Alford, 1726; Julius Alford, born 1717, and the Alvord line. In the previous issue we did one loose line and a short line. We have four descendants of John Madison Alford and we are considering them as a family until they find their connection. We also had Serry Showalters short Alford line that went quickly to England. The two which have not been published yet are William Alford, born 1734 (brother of Thomas) and Lodwick (other than Jacob of 1738). There are two Alfs in the William line and eleven in Lodwicks. Numbers and names for the other families are mentioned on their respective pages.

No Family Group??

Many of the Alfs have not found their connections to very early Alford families or an immigrant. ₩e have given extra thought to how we can help them. In fact, some of you have suggested we publish success stories about the connections made. We just don't have anything to report. Either we haven't helped you or we don't realize that we helped. Our performance in this regard is not as good with Alford as it is with our Newkirk and Chapman effort. We have coded every Alf to their family group or, for those not part of a family, to the year and state to which they have traced their line. We thought we would find a particular state and period in which we could concentrate and help a large group of Alfs. No such luck. Alfs have dead end in fourteen different states and in almost every decade of the 1700's and 1800's. As might be expected most of the dead ends were in Virginia (six) when all time periods were considered. Runners-up with four Alfs each were North Carolina and Georgia. Alabama and Tennessee each had two. A11 the others had only one or two. The time period for most dead ends, irrespective of state, was in the 1810's in which there were seven. The 1830's and 1850's were runner-up with four each. The others were spread over all time frames at rate of one to three.

Must Reach Out For Alfs

It is obvious to us that if we are going to make this system effective enough to help you, we are going to have to get records on more Alfs. We are also going to have to get more of them involved. They get involved by reading our newsletter to find out who needs what from when and where. Unfortunately many of those Alfs tabulated above are not subscribers and don't know what we are doing. Although we cannot afford to send them all the newsletter, we will try to send them a summary occasionally.

More Coverage - Smaller Print

With the increase in family coverage we have found it necessary to include much more, about fifty percent more, information in each issue. To accomplish this we are using the reduced sized print with two columns per page at every opportunity. We have used this to some extent in all three of our family newsletters, ALFORD, CHAPMAN, and NEWKIRK; and so far have had only one negative comment about difficulty in reading. If you have such a problem let us hear from you.

Alford Immigrant Index

It seems it would be worthwhile for us, that is you and the Alfords, not just me and Mary, to build a list of Alford Immigrants. We have some fragments that several of you have sent, and will publish them in the next issue. There must be many more so we would invite all of you to send any and all information you can on Alford immigrants.

Genealogical Glossary

The more involved we become with this subject of Genealogy, the more we realize that we know practically nothing about it. We frequently see terms which we do not understand. "Patents" and Headrights" are two good examples. We have found no place to "look them up" and have come to wonder how all of you learned about them. We have searched and do not find that there is a genealogical dictionary or glossary (other than those included in some other publication) in being. The Genealogical Publishing Co., Inc. does list a *GEOGRAPHIC DICTIONARY* of Connecticut and Rhode Island, but it does not explain what many of you consider common terms. If you know of a publication please tell us about it. In the meantime, lets start building such a dictionary. You send us a list of the genealogical terms that you can think of. If you have a definition we need it (we have no where to go to find it otherwise), if you don't know what it means we will ask others. We have already received some response from our Newkirk readers and are including information from their response in this issue. (see page 24)

Coat of Arms

Some of you have asked about a Alford Coat of Arms. We have nothing on this subject to speak of other than a couple of pages copied and sent in with a drawing and a few comments. If you have any information on the subject that we might put together for our mutual use, please send it along.

Gift Subscriptions


Have you ever considered giving that friend who has Alford connections, or a relative, a gift subscription to ABOUT ALFORDS? We would be glad to enter such a subscription for the current subscription price of \$10. It would be a gift lasting throughout the year, and the recipient just might get hooked on genealogy in which case your gift would last them for generations to come. If you would like to give such a lasting Christmas gift we will send their first issue (this one) so that it arrives the week of December 18th. It will have a special Christmas cover, and if you have a little Christmas message, we will personalize the cover with your message.

Subscription Increase

In this last issue of this year we must make this announcement. So far this year, on our three surnames, we have had to take out of pocket over \$2,000, and there are three months to go yet, to support our "project." We cannot continue at that rate. We do admit that some of this is one time "start-up" costs which we will not have to continuue as we go along. It will help if you will give us just fifty cents per quarter more on renewals, so we are raising the subscription price to \$12 effective January 1 1984. We plan to have such a price announcement in THE GENEALOGICAL HELPER at that time. Until then you can renew your subscription for as many years as you wish for \$10 per year. (We have one fellow who has signed up for five years with a \$50 check). We can do two things to help compensate you for the increased price, without too much increase in cost to us. First we will add two more sheets (four pages) per year. We had been doing 24 one quarter and 26 the next quarter as a general rule to average 25 per quarter or 100 per year. We are increasing that to 26 per quarter. We are going to use more of the columnar layout with a slight reduction in printing size thereby getting almost half again as much information on a page. (This print size is not any smaller than that used in many of the genealogical books we have seen.) As a result you will be getting a lot more information for your dollar in 84.

This is the beginning of a series on Jacob Alford who settled in Kentucky. The only information we have on this line is what was sent to us by Elmer Miller of Dayton Ohio. Elmer is also the only one we know at this time who claims to be a descendant of this line.

We are begining the numbering of the generations and families with number 1 as we have no basis for even making a guess as to how many generations of the line had lived in America before Jacob. As we learn more about Jacobs ancestors, we may see fit to revise the numbering system when we complete the series.

Of the five sons of Jacob who married, we have information on only the first two. We would hope that through your help we will be able to locate more descendants of Jacob and learn more about the other branches of his family.

As with the other family series, the sketches or genealogies will be presented by generation, while the charts on the page opposite from the sketch will normally follow one branch through several generations, ignoring the remaining branches.

When we have collected and published all we can on this line, we will make all corrections and changes sent by you and offer the complete series in one publication, with the sketches in normal size print.

FIRST GENERATION

Jacob Alford

1. Jacob Alford was born about 1726 in Goochland County Virginia. We do not have information as to his parents or origin. He died June 3 1803 in Garrard County, Kentucky.

Jacob of Fluvanna County Virginia married Nancy [Nansie] Ann Hunter of Louisa County Virginia March 4 1779 in Louisa County. Nancy was bors about 1762 in Louisa County, Virgina and died July 19 1847 is Garrard County, Kentucky. She was the daughter of Stephen and Mary (Statham) Hunter, of Louisa County, Virginia.

Jacob Alford had been given warrant #2238 for 100 acres of land January 12 1784 for having served three years as a soldier on the Virginia line. October 27 1797 Jacob Alford purchased 150 acres of land in Garrard County, Kentucky from John Gray, and his wife Elizabeth, who lived in Warren County, Kentucky. The land was on the south side of Smith Spring Branch and it adjoined land which was the property of Smith, Benedict Swope and Charles Alford.

Jacob was wounded in the ankle at the battle of Brandywine and Nancy Alford received a pension because of his service.

It is not known when they moved from Virginia to Kentucky, but it was probably between 1785 and 1787.

Charles Alford

2. Charles, son of Jacob and Nancy (Hunter) Alford, was born December 10 1779 and he was dead by March B 1870. In 1860 he was living with the family of Christopher Brown (*Bis daughter Nancy*).

Charles married twice; first to Rebecca Wilson March 15 1803 (bond) with whom he was living during the 1810 census in Lincoln County, Kentucky. His second was to Elizabeth Gooch September 19 1814 (bond). Elizabeth was still living August 12 1850.

ALFORD DATA BANK

Printed on this page and the one facing is our "B" file. The format and codes were included in the previous issue with the "A" file. We have most of the "B" records that you have sent loaded at this time. We are particularly indebted to Mrs. Bowman (ALFORD FAMILY BULLETIX, publisher) for the records she has sent us. Almost half of these came either from the given name records she let us borrow, or from information published in one of her twelve bulletins.

The "V" between some of the given names and their year of birth signifies that the surname was spelled ALVORB. In the one record with an "L" in this position the surname was ALLFORD. We will explain similar codes in subsequent issues as they are used to distinguish the other spelling variations.

In the last issue we presented a few questions that were raised by the data displayed in the "A" file. A couple of you responded, but we were disappointed that we did not hear from more of you. If we are going to help you, and if you expect to help each other, you are going to have to be more responsive to some of our requests.

We expect the "C" file in the next issue to be about twice the size of this "B" file.

PEDGREE PUZZLES

THE HUMBERS OF THE PARAGRAPHS RELATE TO NARGINAL HUMBERS ON EITHER SIDE OF THE ENTRIES IN THE LISTING TO THE RIGHT AND ON THE FACING PAGE.

1. B. M. or Benjamin H. Alford. The two B. H. AlfORDS came to us on a list of Shelby County, Texas Marriages (1882-1936, sent by Mrs. Shirley Alford. We assumed they were the same person and estimated their date of birth the same based on the first marriage date. The Benjamin H. at the 1. in the second column is an uncle of Gloria Clark. ???? Are all three of these the same person?

2. Benedictus/Benedict. A person by this name is recognized by many as one of the first Alford/Alvord settlers in America. The Benedictus came from information sent by Frances Alford and the Benedict is from several sources (see Alvord series elsewhere in this issue). ???? Is there more than one person of this name who came from England in the early 1600's? Please send in all you have on this person so we can clarify his status.

3. Three of these Benjamins seem to be connected through three generations. Our source for this information was the *peaslips*, given name records, sent to us by Mrs. Bowman who used to publish the ALFORB FAMILY BULLETIN. Part of the family was in the Wilson County, Tennessee area. This line was documented in Mrs. Naomi M. Hailey's TAE ALFORD-DRAKE FAMILY which though contradicting part of Mrs. Bowman's record, is more complete. We have edited both sources and used a combination for the data bank. Look at the sketch written on the Jacob Alford (1738) line elsewhere in this issue. Paragraph number 13 viii identifies Wiley Napoleon Bonapart Alford, who married (1) Nancy Dicey Charles Bilbro (2) Frances Carmack and (3) Mrs. Mary Carney; and he was the fellow who started all of it. We conclude from Mrs. Hailey's account that Wiley, by one of his wives, probably Frances Carmack, had Denjamin L. who married Lela Biggers, they had a son who they named Benjamin Carmack and married Martha Basford. Then this Benjamin had a son named Benjamin R. who married Sherri Durham. Unfortunately we do not have dates or places on most of these records. ???? Can you add to these records? Please send every little bit you can.

4. Three of these Benjamins are probably the same, being a descendant of one of the early Alfords/Alvords to settle in Massachusetts. Each of these tbree came from different sources, named previously. We suspect that all can be merged into one record, but are not sure which bits and pieces to use. ???? Will you please send us all you have on this person? And please, please, give us the source of your information.
