

EDITOR'S COMMENTS

EVALUATION

We recently asked you to help us with the newsletter by evaluating the various features in some of the past issues. Since we consider this to be your publication, we need to know what you want, and what should be reduced in scope or cut out if space is a problem.

We sincerely appreciate the fantastic response we received from many of you. At first we thought those of you who were so kind as to refuse to rate anything below average would blow our evaluation technique. In tabulating the results, we first did only those who carefully followed our instructions. Then we added the results from all those who rated most of the features above average or best. Believe it or not, the ranking of the features remained the same in both cases, with only the magnitude of the spread between the scores of each changing. The following is a summary of the results. The features are listed in order of most liked first and least liked last.

1. ALFORD EXCHANGE
2. FAMILY CHARTS
3. FAMILY SKETCHES
4. ALFORD DATA BANK
5. EDITOR'S COMMENTS
6. FAMILY FEEDBACK
7. PERSONALITIES
8. READERS ITEMS
9. OBITUARIES

We are going to our best to react to your evaluation and give you more of what you want, improving on all of it. For the family exchange, we depend on you and our other Alford contacts for input. If we have to generate the questions for the exchange from our own files, it will not hold the interest which it apparently now attracts.

Family Charts and Family Sketches we can do for sometime to come with the data we have on hand. We do need your input and feedback to keep them accurate and as complete as possible.

In each issue we think we have made the last improvement in the databank, but we have added two minor improvements in this issue. These will probably be the last, but we are always open to suggestions from you.

For our editor's comments to have ranked square in the middle you must be hard up for reading material. We have always felt guilty for taking any space for them, and would prefer not to have any at all. We do recognize that there is some need for administrative remarks.

We are trying to spiff up the Family Feedback feature to make it more like the exchange. While it seems to be more feedback on data bank comments, we really plan to use it for any kind of comments we receive from you, other than inquiries which belong in the exchange. But!! Like the exchange, the feedback feature depends on you.

We really should not have asked for an evaluation on the Personality feature and the Readers items as they had hardly been used.

We want all of you to continue to send obituaries, but we will not publish them as such. We will extract the data from the obits and enter it in the data bank and/or family group records (family sketch format) as appropriate.

We are not going to limit our coverage to just the features shown. We should have asked for a rating on census material, but you had seen so little of it. You will find some in this issue. We would appreciate having your comments on the value or desirability of this type material when you write.

ANNUAL ALFORD DIRECTORY FAMILY REFERENCE FILE

We had planned to send an announcement along with this issue about our first Annual Alford Directory. We have just completed and sent a 100+ page Chapman Directory to the print shop and we have promised a Newkirk Directory for next month. We were going to mail the Alford version in September, but have found the job bigger and more time consuming than we expected. This first directory will be a list of name and address (phone number if we have it) of all our Alford contacts. The list is printed in both alphabetical order and in order of the ALF code to make it easy for you to convert code to a person's name. The main section of the directory is a list of every direct Alford ancestor of every contact. The list includes, to the extent you have sent the data, your ancestors pedigree number, name, date and place of birth and name of spouse. If the ancestor is questionable or is the one on whom you are seeking information, then the list is coded accordingly. It is also coded to show when you have an ancestor in common with another Alf. The list just described is printed by family, alphabetically by Alf. Supplementing this family list are lists sequenced by ancestor, spouse and place of birth, all coded to show questionable, problem, or connecting ancestors. We have our first draft, but still have much work to do. At this point we do not know the price for sure, but since we have already sent an ad to the *GENEALOGICAL HELPER* saying it will be \$15 we will have to keep it at that or below. Whatever the price, subscribers will receive a \$1.00 discount. Expect an announcement with an order form with the October issue.

ALFORD HISTORIANS

We asked for your help in issue number four, but our request was not very obvious and you probably did not see it. In 1898, in a letter to his nephew, Julius Alford of Gallman, Mississippi said the following:

"I have received lately letters and blanks to fill out about the Alford family from M. L. Alford in Lewiston, N.C. and H. C. Alford in Indiana. I complied with their request. It seems they are writing a biography of the Alford family. If you know anything of this write to me about it as several of our relatives out here want it should it ever be written."

Our message to you is the same as that of Julius to his nephew. If you know who M. L. or H. C. Alford were, we would like to hear about it. If you know anything of their work, we would also like to hear of that.

1850 INVENTORY

We are keeping quiet about this because we are the hold up at the present time. We have not processed all the data we have received to the computer. We have some people

just waiting for the signal to proceed with microfilm reading and transcribing data. We do still need help, so if you have access to census microfilm and would be willing, let us hear from you. The Alfs who do not have access to the census data are depending on you and us to make it possible for them to gain access to it. Collecting and publishing it will also be a tremendous service for the Alfs of future centuries.

EXPANSION PROGRAM

In the last issue we solicited your help in contacting present day Alford. There are several thousand Alford families in the country who are not currently part of our program. Many never will be, but some are looking for you and us, and don't know about our program. As a result of our request last quarter some sent phone listings and some sent money. Alicia R. Lee has even written and then called offering her services to assist in work and funds to contact all the Alford in a two state area. We will report more on this in the next issue.

When Alicia first offered to help contact the Alford in Washington and Oregon she wrote that she expected most of them would be her cousins, descending from the Alford who migrated to the Northwest. We responded that we wouldn't be too sure about that. We wrote to a Randy Alford in Orono, Maine figuring he had to be one of the northern Alford, and possibly the Alford who resided in the northern most or eastern most part of the country. Randy responded, now living in Bangor, Maine, but he said if we wanted information on his ancestors, we would have to write his kin in Pike County, Mississippi. He gave us his father and grandfathers name, and we will connect him to one of the many families in Pike county.

Well anyway, Alicia called us a few days later and said when she got our letter she just decided to call those close by. Most of those she called were from Louisiana or Texas. She said they all seemed to be interested in our project.

According to the list we have, which is sorry but better than anything else we know about, there are Alford families in every state of the union and in Washington, D.C. Texas leads the pack with over 1100 families and California and Florida are tied for second with almost 600 each. My home state of Louisiana and North Carolina come next with just over 500 each.

Starting with this issue, we are going to report on some of the results of our effort. If you wish, we can expand the coverage to provide the name and address of all the Alford we are contacting under this program. Let us know your wishes. Unless we are requested to do so, we will not be listing them.

Gerry Showalter sent a \$5 contribution with which we were able to contact 10 families. There was one each in MA, NJ, PA, DC, WV, and NC. There were two in NY and VA. None of the ten responded and the postal service returned the letter we sent to DC.

Jack Eisenlauer sent \$13 with which we contacted 26 Alford. With his we wrote six in FL, four each in MS, GA & NC, three each in SC & AL, and two in TN. The postal service returned two each from NC, GA and FL. We received a good response from one in Florida

and Alabama. The contact in Alabama mentioned us to a brother and he has called us three times. It is just possible that the results from this secondary contact will be worth more than the work and expense in contacting all 36 of these.

If you would like to contribute to the program, we can make a contact for about fifty cents. We select those to contact with your funds using our regular random selection process. We will identify your group and report to you on them.

Those who respond will be introduced in the exchange. Let us know if you want the names and addresses of the others printed.

MR. L. E. ALFORD DONATES COLLECTION

Mr. L. E. Alford has donated to us his entire collection of Alford reference material and correspondence. He wrote us some time ago offering it if we would just come after it. We agreed and started making plans, but before we could get there a personal situation developed that prevented the trip. In the meantime we have arranged the transfer. Several weeks ago UPS brought us a box about the size of a footlocker that I could hardly carry. (We did reimburse Mr. Alford for the cost of packing and shipping)

Included in the material he sent were 44 folders of correspondence, data and various publications. We have not had time to go through all these to catalog the information. There was a booklet he published on his family *ALFORD FAMILY GENEALOGY 1774-1979*.

Also included was a copy of *HANDY BOOK FOR GENEALOGISTS* Fifth Edition. (We have a later edition, but will keep this one as it may some day be a collectors item) and *THE HOME BOOK FOR GENEALOGISTS* Sixth Edition. Many of you have received pages from him from his *MAGAZINE OF AMERICAN GENEALOGY AE-ALLA* Vol 1 #3 October 1929.

The printed lists of the indexes of heads of families from the 1790 census (all states but Virginia) were included in his collection, along with the complete printing of the North Carolina census. (We have our own microfilm of the printed version of the census, but the printed copies of the index are much handier to use).

There were 16 issues of *THE GENEALOGICAL HELPER*, but we had copies of all but five of them. The extra issues are: 1981, July-August, September-October, November-December; 1982, May-June, July-August, September-October, November-December; 1983 January-February, March-April, May-June. We will mail these to those of you who want them on a first come first served basis. We would suggest that when you receive your copy, you might want to slip a few stamps in your next letter to us to cover the cost of our mailing it to you.

Mr. Alford's material will be cared for and preserved. It will be integrated with our other material and someday be passed on by us to the one most likely to carry on our work. If you have, or know of others who have, a collection of Alford historical and genealogical information that ought to be put to good use and preserved, you might follow the example set by Mr. L. E. Alford.

I have always believed it was JOHN ALFORD married Jenney (Jane) MCELHATTEN, but I lost him after 1850 and could not find a record of any kind as to what happened to him. He deserted East Tennessee about 1852, with most of his children. My great grandfather ROBERT CANNON ALFORD remaining in Tenn. I had all but given up hope, but that doesn't pay, I have learned. Now this leaves me with another problem, who are the parents of this JOHN ALFORD, who was an orphan in Grainger County, Tennessee in 1804? The census shows his birthplace as N. C. but it could have been the part that became Tennessee in 1796. Which would have put him in Tennessee at the time of his birth ca 1786.

The JACOB ALFORD in Hawkins County, 1811, frustrates me, I cannot find another thing on him. Where did he go? Were he and JOHN and Thomas of Claiborne County brothers? There was a John Alford who received a land grant in Tennessee from North Carolina, but was assigned to other persons by his heirs, who was this JOHN ALFORD?"

B-97 Mrs. Lloyd (Pat) Fite, 11938 Longleaf, Houston, TX 77024 also has a combination feedback and inquiry. She sent the following: "I am still looking for my SIPPY ALFORD. ALF CELEBRATES 50 MARRIED YEARS

As you can see from the Family Feedback feature each issue, one of our most enthusiastic supporters is David Price, Jr.

He and his wife, Virginia, celebrated their fiftieth wedding anniversary last month. I am sure we are speaking for all Alfs when we send our congratulations, and wish them well.

ALFORD DATA BANK, E-FILE

The E-file of our data bank is so large that to print it all, would take almost all 26 pages allotted to an issue. We are printing only the first part of the file. The balance will be included in the next, or next two, issues.

We explained the format of the data bank in an earlier issue, and have been explaining the changes as we go. Several have written saying they have trouble in reading and

understanding the format.

If you are one of those who have trouble with the format, and would like a special explanation with an example send us a SASE and ask for Data Bank Explanation. If there are enough who need it, we will print a special sheet. We do not include it in the newsletter each time as a thorough explanation takes over half a page.

The annual directories will include an appendix in which there is an explanation of the book codes, other event codes and some county abbreviations.

In the data bank in this issue we have introduced two useful changes. First, each record is numbered for your easy reference in writing to us or others. The number has no significance other than for numbering the entries in this printing. As soon as we add or delete a record from the file, these numbers will be meaningless when related to the actual records in the computer data bank. The number appears just over the name in the top line of the record. We are also introducing a remarks capability. If there is an asterisk (*) followed by a number in the "Ref" field at the right side on the third line of the record, then that means there is a footnote with the printout. (This * is going where the book reference is normally printed. If there should have been a book reference then it is included in the remark. The Chappie code, showing source of data will still be shown at the right of this Ref area.)

KINFOLKS BY Harilee

Several have called or written and asked if I knew where they could purchase a copy of KINFOLKS. It was published about 50 years ago, and I am sure it is out of print. I don't know who holds the rights to the books, but with all the data contained in the books, it seems they would be a good candidate for some reprint company. It is the most thoroughly researched and completely documented genealogical work that we have ever seen, but it is also one of the most difficult to follow.

The National Genealogical Society in Washington, D.C. has a set of the books in their mail loan library. If you are a member, and have paid their special library fee, you can have them mailed to you for your use for ten days. The work is in four volumes, three plus an index. In the first three volumes there is something like 3000 pages, so it is not a book you run to the quick copy machine to reproduce. For those not familiar with the work, it is not all Alford. There are several families included and the Alford coverage is primarily the descendants of Wiley Alford who married Clarissa Fulmore.

We would expect that most of the Alfords mentioned in the book will eventually be included in the family sketch series, being printed in the newsletter.

DAVE IS UNDOUBTEDLY CORRECT. OUR INFORMATION WAS TAKEN FROM A FAMILY BIBLE TRANSCRIPT SENT BY Dr. James M. Edwards. IT WAS THE BIBLE OF SION AND CLARKY MCTYER ALFORD, AND WE FAILED TO MAKE THE CONNECTION TO DR. WARREN, AS THE BIBLE ENTRY WAS JUST THE "D."

19L Gil shows: DAISY RENA ALFORD born September 26 1908 marrying George Newton. It should be George Newton GAGE.

19R Could the DANIEL ALFORD born about 1840 and enumerated in the 1840 Alabama census be WILLIAM D. ALFORD born January 22 1840 in Alabama, the son of ALMOND B. ALFORD and Harriett C. EUBANKS? NO, THE 1840 FOLLOWED BY THE "<" MEANS THIS DANIEL WAS BORN BEFORE 1840. THOSE ENUMERATED IN 1840 WERE ONLY HEADS OF HOUSEHOLDS. THIS PARTICULAR DANIEL HAD A FAMILY WHOS NUMBERS WERE: 2 1 1 1 1 1 1 (denoting ages brackets of male and female). THIS DATA CAME FROM SOME MISCELLANEOUS NOTES SENT BY Dr. Randy Alford, AND DOES NOT RELATE TO ANY PARTICULAR LINE.

21R DAVID C. ALFORD married Martha C. ELLIS. Dave says he shows the name as EDWARD DAVID "DAVE." The wife's middle name is Clayton. DAVID IS CORRECT, AND YOU WILL FIND THIS PERSON LISTED AS EDWARD IN THIS ISSUE. WE KNEW THE MIDDLE NAME OF THE WIFE, BUT SPACE LIMITATIONS PRECLUDED INCLUDING IT.

22R DAVID SHERRILL ALFORD Dave says he shows Sherrill with the two "L's" which is how we spelled his mother's maiden name. He also says he shows her as Parshea Ann Sherrill while we showed her as Ferrine Sherrill. THE

DOUBLE "L" IS CORRECT AND WAS APPARENTLY AN OVERSIGHT ON OUR PART. MISS SHERRILL'S GIVEN NAME WAS RECORDED SEVERAL WAYS ON DIFFERENT LEGAL OR OFFICIAL DOCUMENTS. Ruby Heard HAS RECORDS THAT SHOW THE ABOVE SPELLINGS AS WELL AS FERRENE AND PERRIEN. SHE MARRIED A WILLIAM TIMMONS DECEMBER 23 1824, ABOUT A YEAR AFTER ZADDOCK DIED. WE WILL HAVE TO YIELD TO RUBY HEARD ON THE CORRECT NAME FOR DAVID'S FIRST WIFE. SHE HAS WRITTEN JULIAN IN SEVERAL PLACES. LTC. Ollie M. Ellis ALSO EXTRACTED IT THAT WAY FROM SOME MARRIAGE LISTINGS. WE DID KNOW HER MIDDLE NAME WAS FRANCES, BUT AGAIN WERE RESTRICTED BY SPACE.

22R DELILA ALFORD born 1860 in Georgia. Dave doesn't know anything about Delila, but he knows that the parents we showed were deceased before 1860. He asked if this could be the daughter of grandson BRITTON W. ALFORD born May 21 1840 and who was killed in the Civil War. Dave doesn't know the name of a wife, if any; another grandson was Britton W. born 1843, married 1866. THE QUESTION MARK FOLLOWING THE ENTRY ON THE PARENTS MEANS THE DATA IS QUESTIONABLE. WE WOULD LIKE TO HEAR FROM SOME OF YOU ON THIS ONE. WE WILL PROVIDE ONE CLUE. LOOK IN ISSUE NUMBER 5, OCTOBER 1983, AT THE "B" FILE PRINTOUT. IN IT WE LISTED A BRITTON W. JR. WHO MARRIED A LUDICY ----- ALSO CONTINUE READING BELOW.

23L Dave asked if BURTIS ALFORD, father of DELILAH ALFORD born about 1819, could be the Bertus son of LODOWICK ALFORD and Rebecca FERRELL? WHAT DO YOU THINK? NOTICE THAT THIS FAMILY WAS ENUMERATED IN THE 1850 CENSUS IN TENNESSEE. I THINK LODODWICK'S BERTUS/BURTIS WAS IN GEORGIA AND ALABAMA. BUT THEN THIS BURTIS WAS BORN IN GEORGIA.

23R David shows DIANE ALFORD's husband to be Dr. Advie MCLEAN, not Advil as we have it. OUR SOURCE WAS PAGE 1461 OF HARLEE'S KINFOLKS, WHICH HAS PROVED TO BE PRETTY ACCURATE.

23R Dave shows the mother of DICEY ALFORD to be Betsy Lucidy Brassell and he hastens to say he knows this line is hazy. IT WAS THE HAZY THAT GOT THE QUESTION MARK WITH THIS ENTRY. GOING BACK TO THE "B" FILE IN ISSUE 5. I BELIEVE THAT THE SAME PERSON, A WIFE OF BRITTON OR BRITON ALFORD, HAS HAD HER NAME RECORDED BOTH AS BETSY BRASSELL AND BATHSHEBA BRASSELL AND SOMETIMES IT WAS SHOWN AS BRASSWELL AND BARNWELL. 25L Dave shows the name for DORA VIOLET ALFORD to be VIOLET MEDORA ALFORD, suggesting that Dora was probably a nickname. DORA WAS THE GRANDMOTHER OF ONE OUR ALFS, Novis Odo. NOVIS SENT US A COPY OF THE PAGES OF ALMON ALFORDS OLD FAMILY BIBLE. THERE WERE ACTUALLY TWO ENTRIES FOR HER ON THE BIRTH PAGE. A VERY OLD RECORD ENTERED THE BIRTH UNDER "VIOLET EDORA" WHILE A MORE RECENT ENTRY, ONE WHICH WAS PROBABLY MADE TO MAKE IT EASIER TO READ, SHOWED THE BIRTH AS "VIOLET W." WE HAVE ALSO SEEN IT WRITTEN AS "DORA ELIZABETH." WE HAVE BEEN TRYING TO GET THE FAMILY BIBLE DATA IN SHAPE FOR PUBLICATION IN THE NEWSLETTER, AND WE ASKED NOVIS ABOUT HER GRANDMOTHER. SHE SAYS IT WAS "DORA VIOLET" ON HER MARRIAGE LICENSE.

26L Dave wrote: Drury md Betty Cannon 13 Mar 1782. I show date as 13 May 1782 c/o Lodwick will recorded Greene Co GA 8 Sep 1820. You seem to attribute this data to me. The will filed at that place and date was that of Julius C. who md Rebecca Jackson. He was a son of the original Lodowick and brother of the Drury who md Betty Cannon. At least that is the way I have it recorded." **ON THE DATE OF THE MARRIAGE, OUR MARCH DATE CAME FROM INFORMATION SENT BY Elser Miller WHICH QUOTED THE DOUGLAS REGISTER AS THE SOURCE. FROM OUR OWN EXPERIENCE WE KNOW THAT MAR AND MAY ARE VERY EASILY CONFUSED SO WE ARE NOT SURE. IF ANYONE CAN TELL US WE WOULD APPRECIATE IT. THE REFERENCE TO THE MILL WAS OUR MISTAKE. WE PICKED UP AN IRRELEVANT FRAGMENT OF INFORMATION AS WE WERE LOADING THE DATA BANK. THANKS DAVID!!!**

Ruby Heard of Jackson Mississippi is one of the most active Alfs. She has sent us loads of information, and has done extensive research for us as you will see in some of the future issues. The following, which we have paraphrased, is what she sent on the BRITAIN WASHINGTON ALFORD family.

Brittain Washington Alford was born February 4 1781 in Georgia. He died February 10 1849 in Pike County, Georgia and is buried in the Alford Cemetery near Molena, Georgia. His stone in the cemetery reads: "In memory of Brittain Alford son of Isham and Anna Alford born Feb. 4, 1781 died Feb. 10, 1849 Aged 68 yrs and 6 days. O may our feet persue the way our pious Fathers led with love and holy zeal obey the counsils of the dead. BY ISHAM ALFORD SON OF BRITAIN ALFORD"

He married Bashaba (Barshaba) Brassell March 19 1805 in Greene County, Georgia. Bashaba was born February 10 1785 in Georgia and she died November 19 1854 and is buried in the same cemetery. Her stone reads: "In memory of Barshaba, wife of Brittain Alford dau. of Britton and Dicky (Dicy) Davis Brasselle. Born Feb. 10 1789 and died Nov. 19 1854 Pike Co. Ga. aged 69 yrs 9 mo. 9 days. Must friends and kindred droop and die must helpers be with-drawn while sorrow with a weeping eye, recounts our comforts gone. BY JEMMERSON ALFORD SON OF BARSHABA AND BRITAIN ALFORD. Bashaba, who was also known as Betsy, was the daughter of Britton Brasselle born 1750 in Acadia Canada and died September 1827 in Pike County, Georgia. Britton Brasselle was a Revolutionary Soldier and the progenitor of the Brassell (Braselle) family and his burial place was marked by his descendants at the Brassell reunion in 1981. His wife was Dicey Davis Brassell and both are buried in the Alford cemetery near Molena in Pike County, Georgia.

x. Jimmerson Alford, born June 6 1819, died March 22 1902 in Pike County, Georgia.

Ruby sent information on the children of Thomas Jefferson Alford and a copy of his will. She also gave us the name and address of a descendant of Thomas J. who we hope can help with additional information. Before we do anymore on this line or branch though we would like to get more on ISHAM ALFORD and his wife Anna, the parents of Brittain Alford. His name has also been written ISLAM and ABHAM. He has been reported born in Tennessee, Alabama and Georgia. He did live for many years in Alabama where most of his children were born, and he probably died in Texas about 1870. If you have anything at all on them, please write and send it along. There are several Alfs who need more information on them. **THANKS RUBY!!!**

Writing about people responding to inquiries, a reader in another part of the country wrote: "People may not be as interested as they were in genealogy. The libraries and Archives have lots to offer, but the real information comes from descendants of the people we are looking for and the listings they may have in their files and family Bibles. There is one thing for sure if our generation does not gather all we can on our ancestors and get it in print or into records it will be lost forever. All the old writings are fading and the microfilm is already dim so books that were written years ago will start to fall apart and there goes the history of our close family records. Some of the young people of today will be interested in years to come, of their ancestors and they will have a worse time finding it than we are having at the present time."

ABRAHAM ALFORD

12. Abraham, son of John and Chloe (POPE) Alford, was born about 1787 in Franklin County, North Carolina. He died about 1855 in Greene County, Alabama.

He married Lenor [Linny] WILLIAMS about 1812. Linny was the daughter of Simon and Elizabeth Williams of Bertie, Nash and Franklin Counties, North Carolina. She was born 1788 in Franklin County, North Carolina and died after 1850 in Greene County, Alabama.

Abraham Alford appears first in Franklin County in the tax list of 1809. The first deed in which he appears was dated December 15 1817, when he was deeded land by James Cheves (probably his wife's brother-in-law), and the deed was witnessed by Thomas and John Alford (either his two brothers, or more probably his father and his brother) John Alford, Sr. deeded to Abraham Alford 233 acres on November 9 1820 and the deed was proved at the March Term 1821. In the same court John Alford made deeds of gift to Fenner, Kelly, Rebecca, Henderson, Hilliard, and John H. Alford, who were all probably children of Abraham. The last appearance of Abraham Alford in Franklin County, was on November 21 1826 when he gave power of attorney to Hardy W. Tharp to

apprehend and sell a negro woman who had run away from John Alford, Sr.

Abraham and his family, probably including his father John Alford, Sr., moved to Greene County, Alabama in 1826 or 27. William Lewis deeded to Abram Alford land in Greene County, Alabama May 11 1827. In Tuscaloosa County, Alabama, Benjamin Williams and wife Martha deeded land to Abraham Alford August 24 1833. Abraham Alford and wife Linia made a deed to Asa White May 15 1839.

These are all the Alford's listed in the 1790 heads of family census, as reported in the printed version. Our report is sequenced by state, county and name. We have converted the numbers representing the age brackets of the family members to show that they were born before or after 1775. The column headings identify this breakdown.

All numbers included in the census are shown here. Pay attention to the data from the state of Virginia census, as it was done before 1790 and the format or data enumerated was not the same as other states. With the Virginia data there is no bracket between ages or sex. The William Alford, of Pittsylvania County (family number 89) is not an error on our part. It was recorded in the census as "w" white souls residing in the household, but there were dwellings and out buildings counted. This suggests to us that the resident was black or that the enumerator or compiler made an error.

Subtotals are provided after each state and there are grand totals at the bottom of the report. Don't overlook the problem caused by the different Virginia data, and make some allowances in your use of the data.

Every family in the census has been numbered by the computer and the family number is printed in the extreme right column. These numbers are merely for your use as a reference when corresponding with us or with each other.

We recognize some of these families, but we should all join together now in a concentrated effort to identify and describe each family. We need to develop as much data and history on each of these families as possible. There are also some obvious omissions; families missed in the census. Please send us what you have on any of these families, and give us your opinion on any family you feel should have been included in the census. If you have already sent us something that you know connects with this census, you might want to send us a reminder, as we may overlook it.

DATA BANK, E-FILE I

The information in this print out represents about one fourth of the "E" records we have. It will probably require at least two more, if not three, issues before we have it all printed. This is in keeping with your evaluation which indicated a desire for other things ahead of the data.

In this issue we have begun numbering each record, and you will find the number before each record, just above the "name." These numbers are strictly for reference and have no other meaning.

We also have begun using footnotes or remarks with this issue. These are explained in more detail in Editors Comments. See below in records 5 and 6, the "*" on the right hand side after "Ref:." The following are the remarks applicable to the records in this issue.

REMARKS/FOOTNOTES

*01 It appears that the widow of one E. L. Alford married another E. L. Alford. (Don't you love it when they use initials?)

*02 Could all three of these be the same person, be sure to see #54.

*03 This Edward is often shown as David in family records.

*04 We have conflicting months of birth. March and May. The cemetery record says May.

*05 Original source looks like detailed census of 1840, which is improbable.

*12 Sorry about the out of order, happened when we segmented the file to several issues. Edward is the grandson of John and Jane. No idea as to parents.

As a reminder we should tell you that the first name/line in each record is the Alford, the second line is their spouse and the third line contains the name of their parents. Remember when reading this form that each record is in the same format and space is provided for each data element whether we have information or not. To better understand it, study record number 130 on page 25. It is nearly complete and should be easier to understand. The "E" on the bottom line, followed by a year and place means the person was enumerated in a census in that year and place.
