AAFA has proof positive that the Phebe Cummings who married Thomas, and Thomas, remained in the Virginia area. Phebe was enumerated in 1820 Claiborne County, MS with 2 females 16-26 and 1 male 18-26, 2 males 10-16 and 2 males under 10. Phebe was 45 or over. There were three other Alford families in Mississippi that year and none of them were close or thought to be related.]

Madison, a Notary Public, duly commissioned and qualified according to the law and holding office and acting in and for the above named Parish and State, personally came and appeared Mrs. Frances Pinkston, nee Felton, a resident of the Parish of Morehouse, State of Louisiana, and to me well known, who, being by me first duly sworn, deposes and says on oath; That she is sixty-four (64) years of age, and has resided in Morehouse Parish, Louisiana, all of her life. That her Grandfather, Warren Alford, was married twice, the first time to a Miss Armstrong about the year 1834, and of this marriage the following children were born: Frances Alford and Tom Alford; and that Mrs. Alford died about the year 1837. That the second marriage was to Miss Jane Armstrong about the year 1838, who was a sister of his first wife; that of this marriage to Miss Jane Armstrong two children were born, namely, Mary Ann Alford and Isaih [sic] Alford, sometimes called by nickname "Doss" Alford; and thst [sic] Mrs. Jane Alford, nee Armstrong, died about the year 1842. further states that Tom Alford and Isaih [sic] Alford were both killed in the Civil War, neither ever having been married, and being survived by their Father and Sisters as their sole heirs; that Frances Alford married Josiah B. Davenport, and of that marriage only one child was born which was named James Davenport and which child died during infancy less than one year of age, about the year 1859; that Mrs. Frances Davenport, nee Alford, died about the year 1860 and was survived by her Father and brothers and sisters [sic]. That Mary Ann Alford was married twice, the first time to James G. Felton on February 27, 1862, and of that marriage the following children were born, namely; Thomas Felton, Frances M. Felton, Olive Felton Christopher C. Felton, and Miss Jimmie

Felton; that she married the second time and then to J. J. Worley on May 31, 1872, and of that marriage the following children were born, namely; Annie Worley, Albert Worley, Maude M. 1. That Thomas Felton died in the year 1869 Worley, and an unnamed infant who died at birth. at the age of five (5) years, and therefore without issue. 2. That Olive Felton died in the year 1869 at the age of two (2) years. 3. That Christopher C. Felton was married only one time and then to Mrs. Alice Felton, nee Callen; and of that marriage one child was born, namely, Louis N. Felton - That Christopher C. Felton died about the year 1907, and that Louis N. Felton is at this time a resident of Mer Rouge, Louisiana. 4. That Miss Jimmie Felton died in the year 1906, without even having been married and leaving no issue of her body. 5. That Frances M. Pinkston, nee Felton, the affiant herein, was married only one time and then to L. S. Pinkston; that she is at this time a resident of Mer Rouge, Louisiana. 6. That Annie Worley died at the age of 20 years, without ever having been married and leavong no children, and died in the year 1893. Albert Worley died July 9, 1879 at the tender age of two and one-half (2 1/2) years. 8. That Maude M. Worley was married twice, the first time to Max White, znd the Second time to D. M. Bell, and that she is at this time a resident of Mer Rouge, Louisiana. Affiant further states that Warren Alford Married both times in the State of Mississippi and that all of his children were born there; that at the time he moved to Louisiana, near Mer Rouge, he was a widower and any and all lands that he might have acquired in Louisiana were acquired while he was a widower. Warren Alford died intestate March 1, 1885 at Mer Rouge, Louisiana. Mrs. Mary Ann Worley, formerly widow of James G. Felton, nee Alford, died in the year 1895. Affiant further states that the above information as to her family history is arrived at partly by her own knowledge of facts and partly from the family tradition she learned from her Mother. From "Looking Backward: Memoirs of the Early Settlement of Morehouse Parish [Louisiana]", C. C. Davenport [Christopher Columbus Davenport was the brother of Clarissa Penelope Davenport], Mer Rouge Democrat Press, 1911 - p. 26-27

"In the year 1846 Thomas Andrews, Warren Alford and John W. Alford, came from Yazoo county, Mississippi, and settled close to and on lands adjoining the present town of Mer Rouge." p. 30-31

"I have often answered the question that I am now trying to answer, by relating the following: My father's home was in Prairie Mer Rouge. His nearest neighbor lived almost on opposite sides of the public road. My father was a farmer, his neighbor was a farmer-planter and their plantations at the date of their deaths, had grown to be large plantations and only the traveled public road between their farms. My father's neighbor settled there in the year 1846. He came from Yazoo county, Mississippi, and be brought with him all that he owned, which was, five negro men, their wives and families, and money enough to purchase and pay cash for 744 acres of land. He did nothing but farm, grew nothing but raise corn and cotton: he made moeny and each and every year he bought more lands and more slaves to cultivate the lands. He did his own overseeing; he was humane and kind to his slaves; he was charitable and a good neighbor; he lost his wife before leaving Mississippi and brought with him four motherless children - two sons and two daughters. His daughters married

and made good wives, his two sons became soldiers in the confederate army and both were killed in battle. When the civil war in 1861 came on, that man, that neighbor of my father, owned in his own name, free of mortgage, in his home plantation, 800 acres of land in cultivation, and 1,800 acres of good woodlands. On that farm he had 100 slaves - men, women, and children - worth current prices before the war, \$1,000 - each for average families, which would make his negroes worth \$100,000. His 800 acres open land was worth, current prices, \$50.00 per acre, and his 1,800 acres woodland was worth \$5.00 per acre. On this farm he had 35 head of work mules worth \$12.00 per head. Besides the home plantation above described, this neighbor of my father owned a one-half interest in a tract of land 1,400 acres woodland situated on Bayou Bonnidee, worth \$3.00 an acre and he owned a half interest in 2,600 acres of land in the northeastern portion of Morehouse parish worth \$3.00 an acre. This accumulation of property, mules, cattle and lands, was all made between the year 1846 and 1861 - just fifteen years, and in all those years he made that property doing nothing but farming. He never loaned one dollar of money at interest, never sold one dollar of land in those fifteen years, but he did intelligently, legitimately farm and attend to his own business. That man's name, that neighbor of my father, who was a soul of honest toil and a good and law-abiding citizen, was Warren Alford, and whose history I have given to answer the question, did farming pay."
