AAFA NOTES: SSDI records confirm the birth and death dates of Katherine S. Black (SS# issued in TX), last residence Addison, Dallas Co., TX. Her daughter Sue Behrens reports that Addison was actually her residence and the mailing address for Katherine, whose last residence was Houston in an assisted living facility.

Her husband was the Alford descendant, but Katherine was the genealogist. For most of the rest of her life after her initial correspondence in 1982 with Gil Alford, Katherine was a generous contributor of "Alford" information. She was present and an active participant at the second meeting in Houston. She also made another major and very unique contribution to AAFA and its members. At the Houston meeting she showed us all the Alford "crochet" that she had prepared. She made and donated many of them of different sizes, which we had framed and available for purchase in a "store" that we used to have at all meetings.

Many members of AAFA proudly hang them in their homes. In the September 1990 issue of AAFA ACTION, p. 56, we featured Katherine's crochet:

Mrs. Katherine Black of Houston, TX, AAFA Member #134, has designed and crocheted an extraordinary and unique piece of work honoring the Alford name. It is a delicate, off-white panel ... with the name ALFORD crocheted in block letters in the center. When framed these pieces of handiwork make a very impressive Alford item to display in your home or as a gift. They look great against a dark background or in a clear

frame against the light of a window.
