Charles Haskell Alford was born on May 29, 1925, in Geneva, Texas, the sixth of eight children born to Clarence V. Alford and Laura Lee Carter. He died at home in Palm Harbor, Florida, on December 26, 1925. A celebration of his life was held on December 29,2009, at Bayside Community Church nJfGodinSafetyHarbOr,-Florida, withbUrial in SylvanAbbey Cemetery in Clearwater, Florida. C. H., as he preferred to be called, served in the U.S. Army Air Corp. during World War **n**. Following his discharge from the service in 1946, he attended Lamar Junior College in Beaumont, Texas. Following a call to the ministry he transferred to Anderson College (now University) in Anderson, Indiana, where he graduated in 1950. While there he met his future wife, Aloma Saltzmann,

whom he married in 1951. In 1953 he graduated with a Master of Divinity degree in the first class ofthe newly established Anderson School of Theology. Because his name began with an "P:", he always bragged that he was the first graduate of the school.

Following graduation he assumed the pastorate ofthe First Church of God in New Orleans, Louisiana. This was followed by several pastorates in various parts ofthe country. He retired from his last pastorate in Boca Raton, Florida, in 1989. In 1993, he and his wife moved to Palm Harbor, Florida; in order to be near family. He was active in the prayer and visitation ministries at Bayside Community Church of God in Safety Harbor, Florida, until the time ofhis death.

A dream was fulfilled in 1998 when C. H. and Aloma visited the site of the Castle de Aldford in Aldford Village in England, and the remains of Holt Castle in the town of Holt, Wales., where the family name of Alford is believed to have originated. An account of this trip was published in issue 52 of AAFA Action (Spring 2001).

C. H. was preceded in death by his father Clarence, his mother, Laura, and his five sisters, Helen Belle Brummett, Hazel Lee Stodghil~ Hilda Walker, Gayle Kelly, and Nola Rae Anger and a brother, Felton H. Alford. Survivors include Aloma, his wife of58 years, three children, Grant Alford, Holly Alford King, and Scott Alford, five grandchildren, and a brother, Hoy E. Alford
