Dear Jackie,

Eulon Alford of Hammond set me your recent letter to him. It was certainly nice to hear from you. Several months ago I prepared a computerized genealogy on all I thought we knew on the descendants of your JULIUS HARMON ALFORD. I'd no more than mailed it out when I found I had data from two St. Helena Parish cemeteries which I'd failed to enter.

I sent copies of the computer printout to several folks for their comments, additions, etc. and return. I'm still waiting and hoping but fear the little I received is all I'm gonna get. I sent a copy to your "X" who was a class mate of mine at LSU in the late 50's. A mutual friend in Kentwood said she thought he was going to respond but I never did hear from him.

I'm not from the St. Helena Alfords although my dad was the county agent there for years. We come from the same Washington Parish bunch that Eulon belongs to.

There are some who think that Julius Harmon Alford was the son of JACOB ALFORD-, who came to what was to become Washington Parish in the very early 1800's. I think several things argue against that. One is that as best I can tell Jacob never lived in Mississippi (where Julius Harmon was born). Another is that we do have proof of another son name JULIUS ALFORD who settled in Sabine Parish.



I've long had a feeling that we would eventually prove Julius Harmon to be the son of FORT ALFORD who lived in Lawrence County, MS. Fort was there at the time to fit a Mississippi birth for Julius. We are not confident that we have all of Fort's family accounted for. Fort as well as Jacob migrated to Mississippi and Louisiana from North Carolina. Fort is supposed to have gone to Louisiana in the St. Tammany area to die. St Tammany and St. Helena joined one another in those days before Tangipahoa Parish. One of our members who lives in Oregon is a descendant of a ROBERT TEMPLE ALFORD who was born in Mississippi and raised by a relative north of Lake Pontchartrain. He had a relative named JACK HARMON ALFORD. I can't help but feel we will some day tie all these folks together. The dates and places are all just too close. We need some more research in early St. Tammany records.

You said you'd like to have information on JULIUS HARMON ALFORD, JR. so I'm including what I have at hand- but I doubt if it will help you. From what you say in your letter I suspect you might be able to add to what I have. He was born July 1856, probably in St. Helena Parish and married three times: (1) Martha M. FURLOW, (2) Elizabeth CAREY and (3) Elizabeth CUTRER. I have children listed only from the 2nd marriage. If I follow your letter correctly then Julius Jr.'s daughter WILLIE E. ALFORD was your grandmother. I show her born September 1888- assume St. Helena Parish. The name and date came from the 1900 census.

Over the years we have been in touch with several persons who are descendants of Julius Harmon Alford and are interested in learning more about their family. I can't remember off hand if we have any who are active members of the association now.

I'm enclosing two blank Alford Family Work Sheets. I'd appreciate it very much if you would complete as much as possible on each and return them. Of course you need not duplicate the detailed information- just make reference to the other sheet when the same family appears on both. I'll build this data into the computer file I have and also use it to publish an inquiry about Julius Harmon Alford - or any of the other Alfords on which you might want to get information.

You mentioned "\$20 registration fee" in your letter to Eulon. Actually it is a \$5 registration fee and \$15 for the first years dues. Much of that is used to pay for printing and mailing one of the best family publications in the country. It is edited by our Director of Publications, Pamela Alford Thompson who lives in California. I'd be foolish to promise that the association will find all your Alford answers but I can't think of a better way to invest your money on the chance that it might help. Even if you don't learn more about your ancestors I think you will enjoy the publication which should make you take pride in the fact that you have Alford ancestors and maybe even that you thought, at one time at least, it was well to marry one.



Of course she does not have the resources at hand to provide the help that we can from here. She will help in any way she can and I'm sure she would be happy to hear from you. Like Eulon and myself she traces her Alfords through the Washington Parish bunch.

You might think from what I've written that this is a Washington Parish clan but that is not so. We have members in most states and England. We have members who belong to many different branches of the family and we have not found connections to prove any kinship between the many branches represented. Louisiana is on of the top two or three states in AAFA membership.

I'm sending Eulon and Sally a copy of this letter so they will be up to date on what is happening.

Please let me know if you think there is anything else we can do for you.

My daughters gave me your name after they talked to you recently in Mannino's Pharmacy in Hammond. As they told you I am researching the Alford family history for them. Their father, Shelby Gene Alford (my ex-husband) is the son of Shelby (Bumbo) Alford, of St. Helena Parish. Shelby and I descend from the same family tree.I am the daughter of L. M. McDaniel of Kentwood. Daddy's mother - my grandmother McDaniel - was an Alford so I will actually be tracing the same family line for my children. Shelby and I are, in actuality, fourth cousins.

My great-great grandfather was Julius Harmon Alford, Sr.- my dad, L. M. McDaniel's mother, Bessie Alford McDaniel, was the daughter of Julius Harmon (Dool) Alford, Jr. Dool was a brother to Robert Parish Alford who was the grandfather of Bumbo. Bumbo's father was W. C. (Neil) Alford. I would especially like to obtain any information I could on Dool, as there is some question as to whether my grandmother's given name was Willie Eugene or Bessie.We think that Bessie is actually a nickname, however, her tombstone says Bessie.
