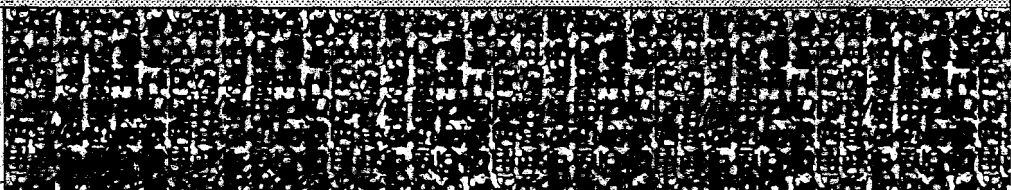

DECLARATION FOR REMARRIED WIDOW'S PENSION

SECTION 2, ACT OF SEPTEMBER 8, 1916.

COUNTY OF Oneida

On this 18th day of June 1921, personally appeared before me, a Notary Public Alaura Ferris

who, being duly sworn by me according to law, declares that she is 77 years of age, and that she was born Jan 27th 1844 at Fairfield ny

That she was formerly the widow of Alfred Myers who enlisted 1862 at Little Falls ny

under the name of Alfred Myers as a Private in 157d Regiment

and was honorably discharged, during the Civil War having served therein during the civil war. That he also served during last part of war

That otherwise than as herein stated said soldier (or sailor) was employed in the United States service.

That she was married to said soldier (or sailor) June 1864, under the name of Alaura Miller at Deane ny by Rev. Chas. Dibble; that she had not been previously married; that he had not been previously married;

That said soldier (or sailor) died Liberty, Oregon, 1. Do not know exact date and that she was not divorced from him.

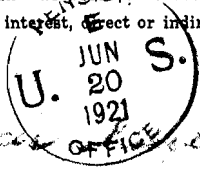
That she was not formerly pensioned as the widow of said soldier (or sailor), the number of her pension certificate being no; that her pension or right to pension terminated because of her marriage; that he died; or, that she was divorced from him upon her own application and without fault on her part; that he did serve in the Army, Navy, or Marine Corps of the United States.

That she did not marry again after the death of the soldier (or sailor), except to Benjamin Ferris (if claimant contracted any other marriage after the death of the soldier (or sailor), name of husband, date and place of marriage, and date and manner of its dissolution should be stated.)

That she makes this declaration for the purpose of being placed on the pension roll of the United States a remarried widow, under the SECOND SECTION of the ACT OF CONGRESS APPROVED SEPTEMBER 8, 1916. That she hereby appoints M. ELLIOTT WAGGAMAN, OF WASHINGTON, D. C., her true and lawful Attorney, to prosecute her claim.

INSTRUCTIONS.

This form is ONLY to be used by or in behalf of a widow who remarried and is again a widow, who desires to claim pension under the second section of the Act of September 8, 1916, above quoted, on account of the service of an officer or enlisted man of the Army, Navy, or Marine Corps, during the Civil War.

Declaration and testimony in support of same to be executed before some officer authorized to administer oaths for general purposes. If such officer is not readily available, to have and use a seal, his official signature, and term of office must be certified by the proper State, County, or city officer under his official seal, unless a certificate has been filed in the Bureau of Pensions for general reference.

AN ACT

To amend an Act entitled "An Act to increase the pension of widows, minor children, and so forth, of deceased soldiers and sailors of the late civil war, the War with Mexico, the various Indian wars, and so forth, and to grant a pension to certain widows of the deceased soldiers and sailors of the late civil war," approved April 19, 1908, and for other purposes.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, * * * * *

Sec. 2. That any widow of an officer or enlisted man who served in the Army, Navy, or Marine Corps of the United States during the civil war whose name was placed or shall hereafter be placed on the pension roll, under any existing law, and whose name has been or shall hereafter be dropped from said pension roll by reason of her marriage to another person who has since died or shall hereafter die, or from whom she has been heretofore or shall be hereafter divorced upon her own application and without fault on her part, shall be entitled to have her name again placed on the pension roll at the rate allowed by the law under which she was formerly pensioned, and the law or laws amendatory thereof, unless she be entitled to a greater rate of pension under the provisions of section one of this Act, such pension to commence from the date of filing her application in the Bureau of Pensions after the passage of this Act:

Provided, however, That where the pension of said widow on her second or subsequent marriage has accrued to a helpless or idiotic child, or a child or children under the age of 16 years, she shall not be entitled to renewal under this Act unless said helpless or idiotic child, or child or children under 16 years of age, be then a member or members of her family and cared for by her, and upon the renewal of pension to said widow payment of pension to said child or children shall cease:

And provided further, That the provisions of this Act shall be extended to those widows, otherwise entitled, whose husbands died of wounds, injuries, or disease incurred during the period of their military or naval service, but who were deprived of pension under the Act of March 3, 1865, because of their failure to draw any pension by reason of their remarriage, and to any person who was lawfully married to an officer or enlisted man, who served in the Army, Navy, or Marine Corps of the United States during the civil war and was honorably discharged therefrom and has since deceased, and who, having remarried since his death is again a widow, or has been divorced from her last husband upon her own application without fault on her part and who, otherwise entitled, was barred by reason of such remarriage from receiving pension under any existing law. * * * * *

Sec. 4. That no claim agent or attorney shall be recognized in the adjudication of claims under the first section of this Act, nor shall any claim agent or attorney be recognized in the adjudication of claims under the second section of this Act for renewal of pension previously allowed, and in claims for original pension under section two of this Act no greater sum than \$10 shall be allowed for services in preparing, presenting, or prosecuting such claim, which sum shall be payable only upon the order of the Commissioner of Pensions under such rules and regulations as he may deem proper to make.

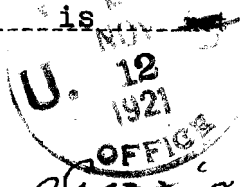
