This is it, the final printed edition of the AAFA Action quarterly. The very first edition of the quarterly published in June of 1988 consisted of eight pages. This column was then called "The President's Precept" and was written by the first President of the AAFA, Capt. Lodwick "Wick" Alford. From that, it eventually grew to a total of 225 pages in the spring of 2004 issue. That issue was dedicated to Louisiana Alfords, as Baton Rouge was the location of the annual meeting that year. Pam Thompson was the first editor. She got the quarterly up off the ground and running and kept it on a tight schedule for a number of years. Eventually, Pam resigned and for a while, in order to keep the quarterly from dying away then, a committee was formed. Unfortunately, as usually happens with committees, it took forever to get something to the printer. The committee did perform admirably over the year or two that it was in existence. Eventually, Jim and Sue Adams, with a little friendly persuasion, stepped forward to take the reins. Eventually, they got the quarterly back on schedule and for ten years did a great job of publishing AAFA Action. They too got the urge to do other things and resigned from the position of co-editors in 2010.

Since that time, we have searched high and low for a volunteer to assume the position of editor of AAFA Action. Although there have been a couple of volunteers for the position, none came to fruition for one reason or another. So, it is with the publishing of Issue #98 of the AAFA Action quarterly that we must bid adieu to the printed version of the quarterly.

With the passing of the quarterly, we will now turn more of our time and attention to the AAFA web site, **www.alfordassociation.org**. We realize that we may disenfranchise some of our members who do not have access to the Internet and for that, we deeply apologize. But, we are able to reach not only more people in the U.S. but all over the world. At the same time, this can be done at a much lower cost then printing the quarterly. It was for that reason, as well as others, that it was decided to do away with the annual dues and charge only a one-time fee of \$5.00 to all new members who join.
